Two held with fake school certificates

NEW DELHI: Two men have been arrested for offering fake certificates to students for Rs 25,000 to Rs 1 lakh. They allegedly used to pick up weak students and pose as teachers giving tuitions at a cheap rate.

If the students failed in the exam, the accused would arrange fake migration and school leaving certificates, and

even <u>marksheets</u> of their current school to facilitate admission in another school. They also used to be in touch with school staff who verified the documents.

"The arrested have been identified as <u>Narender Arora</u> and Lallan Kumar, who have studied up to Class XII. They were arrested on September 19 from Sector 3, Rohini, when they came to meet a client to finalize a deal," said Ravindra Yadav, additional CP (crime).

Fake school <u>leaving certificate</u> of a private school, 17 duplicate seals of different schools and 21 educational certificates with blank letters bearing fake signatures of school principals were recovered, Yadav added.

ACP K P S Malhhotra of the special investigation team was assigned the probe after DCP Kumar Gyanesh's team received a tip-off. "A decoy customer with Rs 20,000 was sent to make the deal in Rohini. Within half an hour, the accused produced a forged school leaving certificate of a prominent public school of Delhi," Yadav said.

Police are trying to arrest two others, Gyanesh said.
